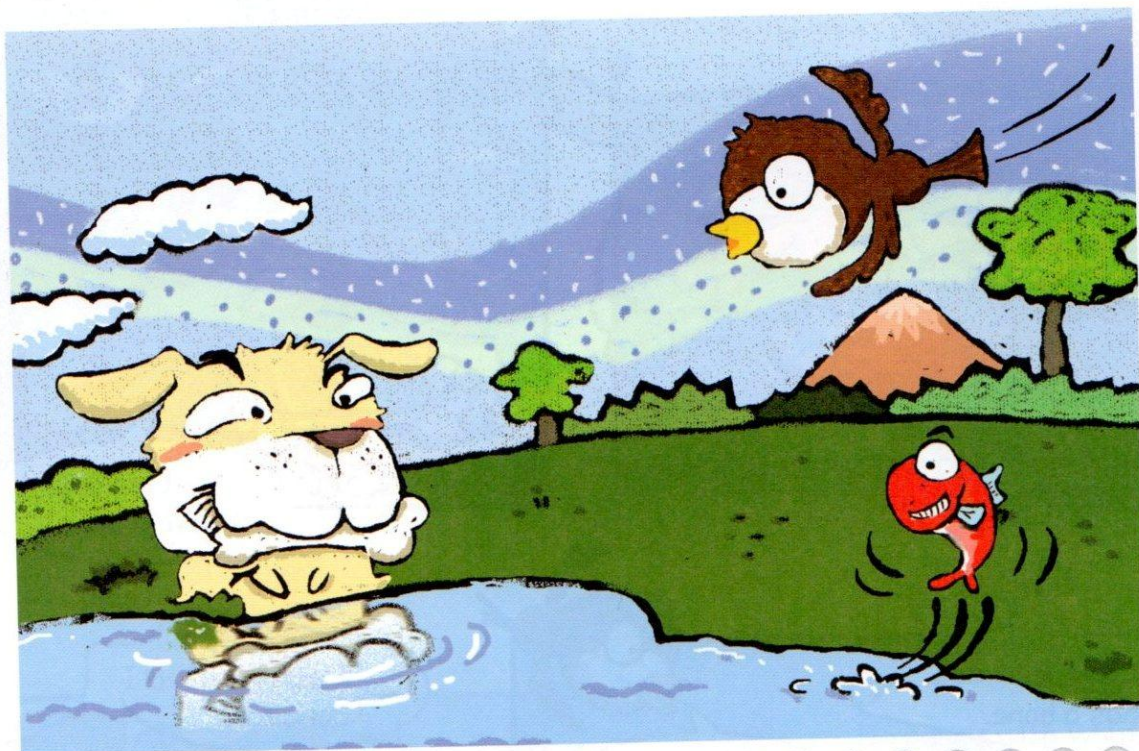

- ★Do you know anything about the story?

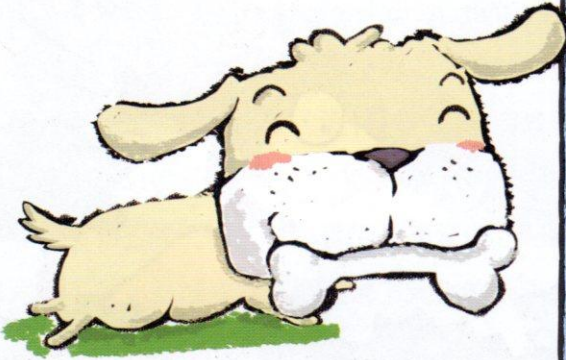
### What to Learn

"Hello, Dog," said the bird.

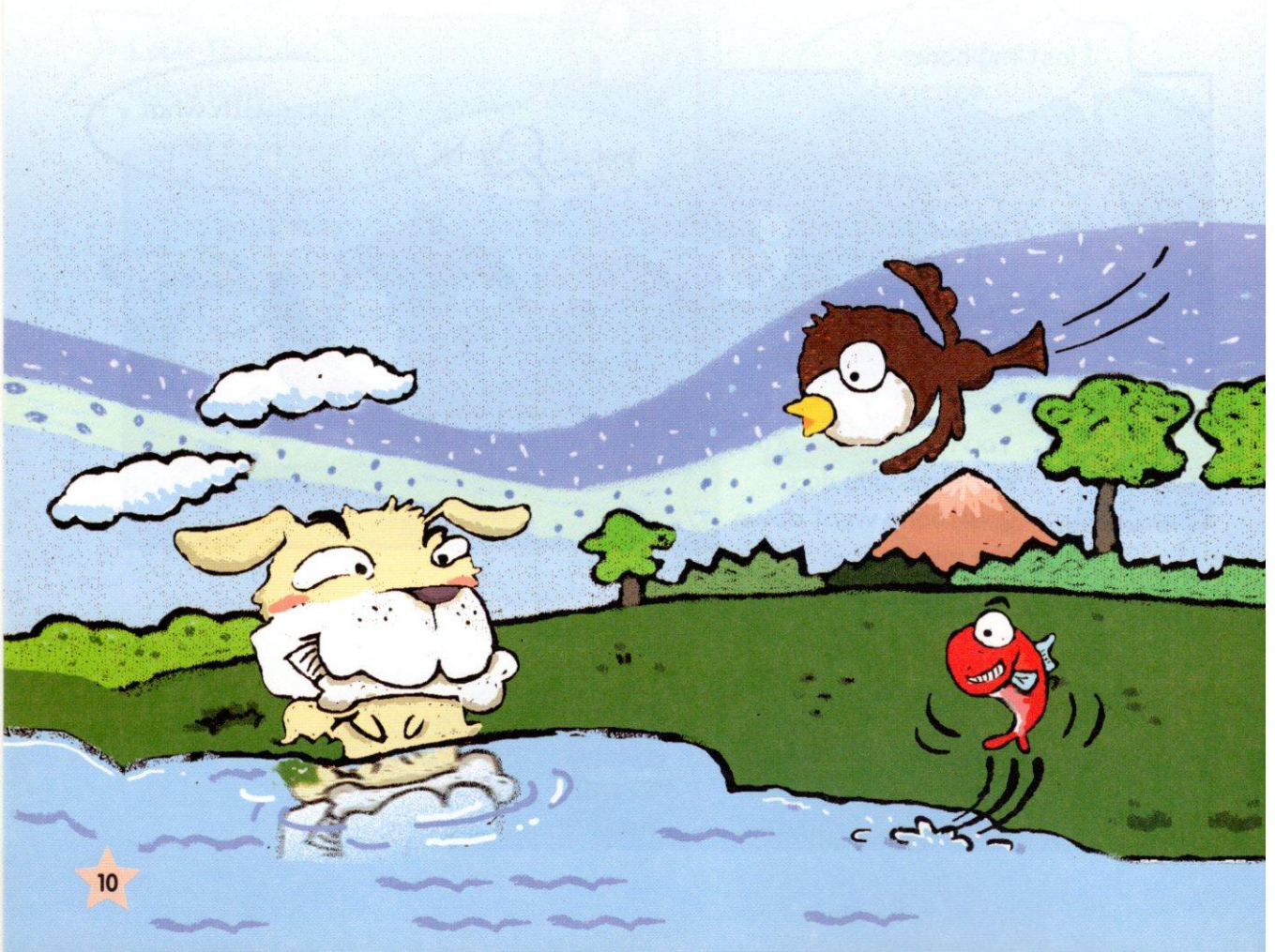
"Hi, Bird," said the dog.

The story is about a mouse who was caught by a lion. But the lion didn't eat the mouse. In return, the mouse saved the lion's life some time later when he was in trouble.

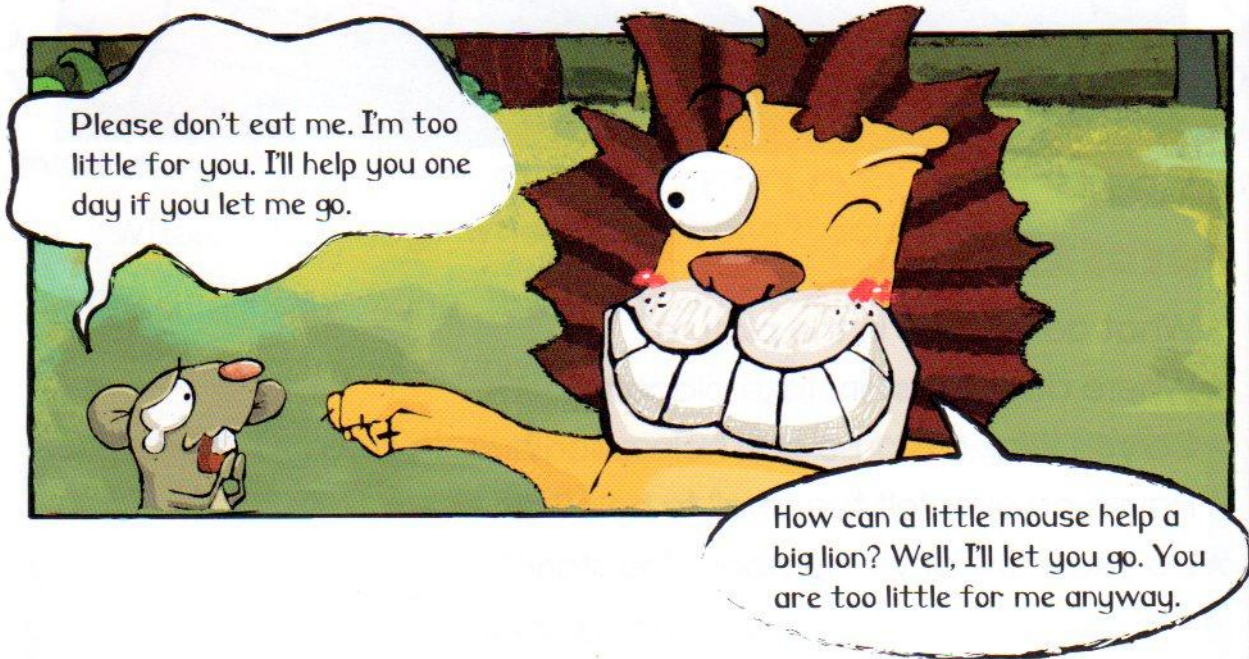
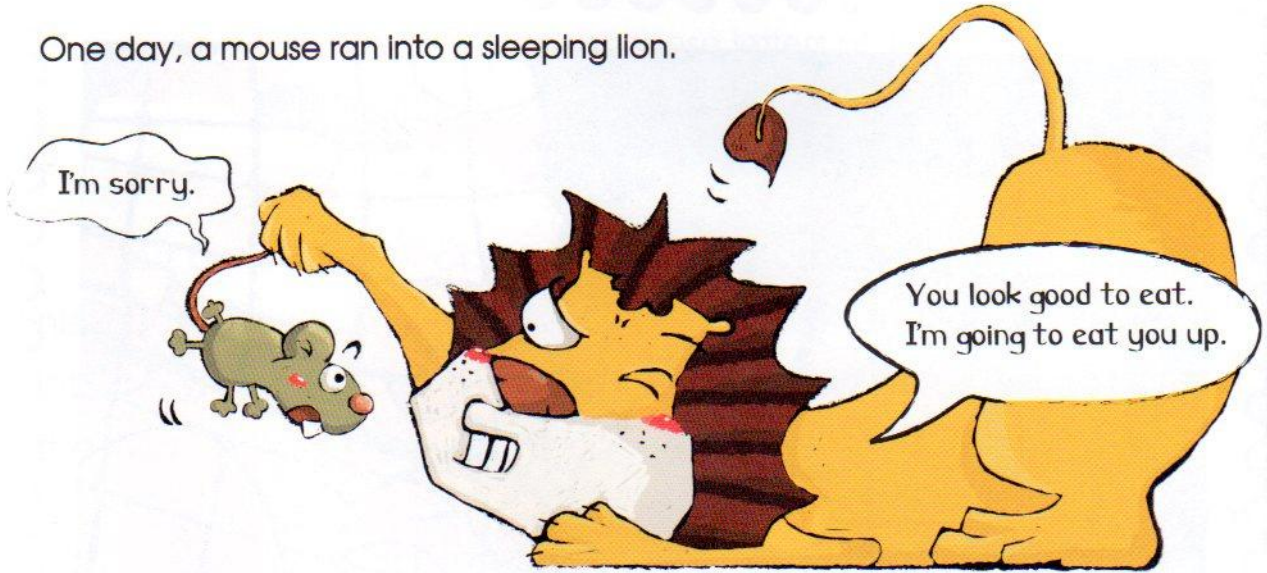
Children reflect on keeping promises and doing favors. Discuss with the kids the idea that size doesn't matter when it comes to kindness. We are never too little to help.

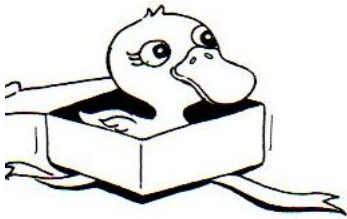
## A Little Christmas Story
